








The Sharing Cities Alliance is a network that connects cities worldwide and fosters city-to-city collaboration, empowering urban governments to address the Sharing Economy.

In the next two dicades, three-quiverers of the 9 billion people in the world will live in a city, by making efficient use of resources, enabling community sharing, we can become sustainable.

Automatic When Seoul, Korea, announced that they were becoming a sharing city, we thought, Amsterdam could benefit too. We carried out some research and discovered that 84% of people here were willing to share. We saw the potential

potential. Peter: We brought together the City Hall, the public library, insurance companies and banks, plus heighbourhood, community groups and Sharing Economy platforms. Basically, everyone that makes a city a city. Harmen: It's about broingin these different groups around the table to explore, learn, make mistakes and grow from these. The city government of Amsterdam has embaced the Sharing Economy and addressed the opportunities and challenges. They were one of the first cities workwide to agree regulation surrounding Airbnb. In 2017, we launched the Sharing Cites Allance. Cites who sign up can access knowledge, regulations, ideas, and case studies.
